ORDINANCE No. 27 OF THE RECTOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WARSAW

of 28 February 2022

on amending Ordinance No. 142 of the Rector of the University of Warsaw of 1 October 2019 on the introduction of the Rules and Regulations of Students' Benefits at the University of Warsaw

Pursuant to Article 95, section 2 of the Act of 20 July 2018 – the Law on Higher Education and Science (consolidated text: Journals of Law of 2021, item 478, as amended), it is hereby ordered as follows:

§ 1

The Rules and Regulations on Students' Benefits at the University of Warsaw, annexed to Ordinance No. 142 of the Rector of the University of Warsaw of 1 October 2019 on the introduction of the Rules and Regulations on Students' Benefits at the University of Warsaw (consolidated text: UW Monitor of 2021, item 215), are hereby amended as follows:

- 1) in § 2, section 1, point 4 shall read:
- "4) scholarship coordinator an employee appointed by the head of the teaching unit (KJD) or Rector to handle matters related to granting social scholarships to students of the particular field or fields of studies;
- 2) in § 5:
 - a) section 3 shall read:
- "3. The total period for which benefits shall be due for students of the first-cycle, second-cycle and long-cycle studies shall be 12 semesters regardless of their receipt by the student provided that within this period benefits shall be due for:
- 1) first-cycle studies for no more than nine semesters;
- 2) second-cycle studies for no more than seven semesters;
 - b) section 5 shall read:
- "5. The provisions of sections 3 and 4 shall apply to students who have studied or obtained professional titles and academic degrees abroad.",
 - c) section 6 shall read:
- "6. Where the disability has occurred during the course of studies or after obtaining the professional title, the student shall receive the scholarship for persons with disabilites for an additional period of 12 semesters.",
 - d) following section 8, section 9 and 10 shall be added and read as follows:

- "9. The total period of time referred to in section 3 shall be longer by two semesters if the student has enrolled for the long-cycle studies, the duration of which, as specified in the study programme, is either 11 or 12 semesters.
- 10. The period referred to in sections 3 and 6 shall include all semesters of studies started by the student as referred to in section 3, including semesters falling during the period of taking leaves referred to in § 43, section 1 and § 44, section 1 of the Rules and Regulations of Studies, with the exception of subsequent first-cycle studies started or continued after obtaining the first bachelor's, bachelor of science's or equivalent degree. In the case of studying more than one field of studies, semesters pursued simultaneously shall be treated as one semester."

§ 2

- 1. In case of applications for a social scholarship and applications for a place in the student hall of residence of students studying in the fields of study organised in the teaching unit, which are submitted:
- 1) starting from the summer semester of the academic year 2021/2022 the head of the teaching unit may apply for their consideration by the Rector, after consultation with the Student Self-Government Council of the teaching unit, no later than 14 days from the effective date of the Ordinance;
- 2) in the academic year 2022/2023 and in subsequent years the head of the teaching unit may apply for their consideration by the Rector, after consultation with the Student Self-Government Council of the teaching unit, no later than one month before the beginning of the academic year to which they relate.
- 2. The application referred to in section 1 shall be submitted to the Vice-Rector responsible for teaching and learning.
- 3. Failure of the Student Self-Government Council to express the opinion referred to in section 1 within seven days from the date of receipt of the request for its issuance shall be considered as the expression of a positive opinion.

§ 3

The ordinance enters into force on the day it is signed.
