**RESOLUTION No. 134
OF THE SENATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WARSAW**

dated 20 April 2022

on amending the Resolution No. 62 of the Senate of the University of Warsaw of 16 June 2021 on the conditions, procedure and deadlines for the admission procedures applicable for the first-cycle studies, long-cycle studies, and the second-cycle studies at the University of Warsaw in the academic year 2022/2023

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 70 section 1 of the Act of 20 July 2018 - the Law on Higher Education and Science Act (consolidated text: Polish Journal of Laws of 2020, item 574, as amended), pursuant to the provisions of Article 96 section 1 of the Act of 12 March 2022 on assistance to citizens of Ukraine in connection with the armed conflict on its territory (Polish Journal of Laws of 2022, item 583, as amended),

the Senate of the University of Warsaw resolves as follows:

§ 1

In Resolution No. 62 of the Senate of the University of Warsaw dated 16 June 2021 on the conditions, procedure and deadlines for admission procedures applicable for the first-cycle studies, long-cycle studies and second-cycle studies at the University of Warsaw in the academic year 2022/2023 (Monitor UW of 2021, item 160, as amended) the following Chapter 4a is inserted in Chapter IV:

**“Chapter 4a
Candidates from Ukraine**

§ 40a

1. Detailed conditions and procedures for the admission of citizens of Poland and citizens of Ukraine referred to in Article 1, section 1 and 2 of the Act of 12 March 2022 on assistance to citizens of Ukraine in connection with the armed conflict on its territory (Polish Journal of Laws of 2022, item 583, as amended), - arriving to the territory of the Republic of Poland from the territory of Ukraine in connection with the

warfare carried out on the territory of this country, is set out in Appendix No. 6 to the Resolution.

2. The limit of admission to studies within the terms and conditions of the admission procedures referred to in section 1 shall be specified in Appendix No. 7 to the Resolution.”

§ 2

1. Appendix No. 6 to the Resolution shall be amended as set out in Appendix No. 1 to this Resolution.

2. Appendix No. 7 to the Resolution shall be amended as set out in Appendix No. 2 to this Resolution.

§ 3

The Resolution shall enter into force on the day it is signed.

Detailed conditions and procedures for admission to the first year of first-cycle studies, long-cycle studies and second-cycle studies at the University of Warsaw for candidates from Ukraine in the academic year 2022/2023

§ 1

These rules and procedures apply to Polish and Ukrainian citizens referred to in Article 1, sections 1 and 2 of the Act of 12 March 2022 on assistance to citizens of Ukraine in connection with the armed conflict on its territory (Journal of Laws of 2022, item 583, as amended), arriving to the territory of the Republic of Poland from the territory of Ukraine in connection with the warfare carried out on the territory of this country, hereinafter referred to as the “candidates from Ukraine”.

§ 2

1. Candidates from Ukraine can be admitted to the studies in the following options:

- 1) admission for studies starting in the academic year 2022/2023;
- 2) continuation of studies started at a home university on the territory of Ukraine.

2. In the admission procedure, candidates from Ukraine shall confirm their status referred to in § 1, by uploading into the IRK system a scan of an official document confirming arrival on the territory of the Republic of Poland from the territory of Ukraine in connection with the warfare conducted on the territory of this country after 23 February 2022, under pain of leaving the application for admission unprocessed.

3. Candidates from Ukraine admitted under the procedure referred to in section 1 shall acquire student rights upon taking the oath referred to in § 10, section 1 of the Study Rules and Regulations in force at the University of Warsaw. They shall take the oath on the first day of the month following the date of the decision on admission.

4. The cycle of studies for students admitted under the procedure referred to in section 1, item 1 shall commence:

- 1) on 1 October 2022 - for students starting their studies in the winter semester of the academic year 2022/2023;

- 2) on 20 February 2023 - for students starting their studies in the summer semester of the academic year 2022/2023;

§ 3

1. The admission procedure for candidates from Ukraine is carried out by an admission committee.

2. For the purpose of admission procedure for candidates from Ukraine, the Rector, at the request of the head of the teaching unit, may appoint a separate admission committee. The deadline specified in § 6, section 1 of the Resolution shall not apply.

3. The provisions of the Resolution on Examination Boards shall apply respectively.

4. Verification of candidates' knowledge and skills takes place in the form of a written or oral entrance examination or interview. In the case of a written examination, it shall be held on the premises of the University of Warsaw.

5. The admission committee will make an announcement in the IRK system and on the website of the teaching unit at the beginning of admission process, but no later than seven days before the day of the examination or interview:

- 1) the scope and form of the examination or interview;
- 2) the number of study places in a given admission round;
- 3) the total number of points possible to score;
- 4) the date and place of the examination or interview.

6. A person who declares that he or she has the appropriate educational background may be admitted to take part in the admission procedure.

7. When entering the admission procedure, a candidate from Ukraine declares the level of knowledge of foreign languages, including whether he/she has the knowledge of the language of instruction in speech and writing enabling studies in the chosen field of study. If the candidate indicates that he or she has such knowledge, then the examination or interview shall be conducted solely in that language. If the candidate indicates that he or she does not have the required knowledge of the language of instruction, then the admission committee may decide that the examination or interview will take place in one of the foreign languages declared by the candidate.

8. In order to qualify for admission, students must obtain at least half of the points available in the examination or interview, however, the result of which must qualify a candidate in the ranking list in the admission quota provided for in the admission round.

9. Candidates from Ukraine qualified for admission in a field of study conducted in Polish take a competence test in order to establish the level of proficiency in the Polish language, hereinafter referred to as "the competency test". In case of confirmation of the knowledge of the Polish language at an appropriate level enabling studies in a given field of study by a candidate from Ukraine during an examination or

interview, the admission committee shall exempt such a candidate from taking the competence test.

10. The scope, date and method of conducting the competency test are announced by the Director of the Centre for Polish Language and Culture for Foreigners "Polonicum" of the Faculty of Polish Studies of the University of Warsaw.

11. Depending on the result of the competence test, a decision on admission of a candidate from Ukraine to a study shall stipulate that he/she must confirm to the relevant head of the teaching unit, as appropriate:

- 1) achieving Polish language proficiency at the A1 level, within two months of the beginning of the training cycle;
 - 2) achieving Polish language proficiency at the A2 level, within four months of the beginning of the training cycle;
 - 3) achieving Polish language proficiency at the B1 level, within seven months of the beginning of the training cycle;
 - 4) achieving Polish language proficiency at the B2 level, within ten months of the beginning of the training cycle;
- under pain of revoking the decision on admission pursuant to Article 162 (2) of the Code of Administrative Procedure.

§ 4

1. For admission as a continuation of studies started at a home university in the territory of Ukraine, referred to in § 2, section 1, item 2, the provisions of § 1-3 shall apply respectively, whereby the examination or interview is intended to verify that the candidate from Ukraine has achieved the learning outcomes required for study at a particular stage of study.

In addition, the admission committee shall take into account for this purpose other documents submitted by the Ukrainian candidate, in particular the candidate's previous study programme.

2. The admission of a candidate from Ukraine to study as a continuation of studies shall be refused in particular if the scope of programme differences required to be completed by a candidate from Ukraine is excessive.

3. On the basis of the verification carried out in the course of the admission procedure, the head of the teaching unit appoints the candidate from Ukraine the date and manner of making up the programme differences.

4. If it is not possible for a candidate from Ukraine to present documents from his/her home university operating on the territory of Ukraine certifying the periods of studies, passed exams, credits or professional traineeship, the candidate shall declare that for specific reasons related to the warfare taking place on the territory of Ukraine he/she is unable to present them.

In this case, the admission committee will verify the candidate's declared periods of study, examinations passed, credits and traineeship, and in particular, may instruct a candidate from Ukraine to obtain and submit, within a specified period of time, from the academic staff indicated by the admission committee, appropriate confirmation of the learning outcomes achieved.

5. If a candidate from Ukraine is admitted as a continuation of studies, the head of the teaching unit shall immediately notify the candidate's home university about this fact. The above notice may be given by electronic means

§ 5

1. A candidate from Ukraine qualified for admission shall submit documents specified in § 6 of the Ordinance No. 24 of the Rector of the University of Warsaw of 28 February 2022 on detailed rules and regulations governing the admission procedure for studies in the academic year 2022/2023 (Monitor UW of 2022, item 51);

2. A candidate from Ukraine is exempted from the obligation to submit a legalisation, apostille certificate and certified translation of the matriculation certificate or higher education diploma drawn up in a foreign language. A candidate from Ukraine shall submit an ordinary translation of these documents; in a justified case, the Rector may oblige a candidate to submit a certified translation of the documents.

3. In the event that a candidate from Ukraine, for reasons related to the warfare taking place on the territory of Ukraine, does not have the documents referred to in section 1, they shall submit a statement of the qualifications entitling them to pursue a given degree programme at the University of Warsaw and of the circumstances preventing them from submitting the required documents.

4. In the case referred to in section 3, the Rector's decision on admission includes a reservation about the obligation to submit documents to the appropriate head of the teaching unit within 12 months of the date of starting the studies cycle, and no later than two months after the end of the warfare taking place on the territory of Ukraine - under pain of revoking the decision pursuant to Article 162 (2) of the Code of Administrative Procedure. In justified cases, the Rector may, by means of an amendment to the decision, extend the deadline for submission of documents.

§ 6

Candidates from Ukraine are exempt from the payment of the admission fee.

§ 7

1. The Rector may authorise the head of the teaching unit to issue the administrative decisions referred to in this Appendix.

2. The head of the teaching unit shall ensure that the Ukrainian candidate fulfils the reservations stated in the admission decision.

3. The administrative decisions referred to in this Appendix shall be served by electronic means. Where it is not possible to deliver decisions electronically, they shall be delivered at the premises of the higher education institution within one month of the day on which the person concerned is informed that the decision has been issued. The addressee of the decision shall be obliged to receive it without delay.

4. If an administrative decision is not served in the manner referred to in section 3, it shall be served in accordance with the general rules.

§ 8

1. The provisions of the Resolution shall apply respectively to the admission of candidates from Ukraine in matters not covered by this Appendix.

2. Candidates from Ukraine may participate in the admission procedure conducted on a general basis.

§ 9

Admission to studies under the rules and procedures set out in this Appendix shall be conducted from 29 April 2022."
